THE VISIBLE VESTRY

- Financial Report pledges are down a little, but we're still doing okay.
- We have paid for the steeple replacement the total cost was \$41,000, our cost was \$1,000. the deductible only.
- Our Reopening Shepard approved all the changes made to St. Peter's. The next step towards
 reopening was to complete a check and to have the Vestry approve it. The Vestry approved the
 Reopening Checklist from the diocese. We can now submit the checklist to the diocese. Once
 approved, we can move forward towards having services indoors.
- The diocese wanted to know if we were interested in a new interim, a bridge priest, supply or stay as
 we are right now. We are going to continue with lay people officiating at the services for now. We can
 request supply clergy once communion is going to be available. Because the Search Committee is
 moving forward so well, we decided against another interim.
- The vestry voted to open a St. Peter's Zoom account cost approximately \$199.00 for one year. The Search Committee will use it to interview prospective clergy.
- YouTube services are very popular. Here is listing of views:

- The numbers of the views increases during the week so there will be an update of numbers later.
- The steeple should be installed soon.
- The Search Committee has interested applicants and they will be starting interviewing this week.
- Suzanne Ott will be updating our website.
- Being that Friendly Kitchen is no longer functioning, we have a great deal of food stored. We thought Church of the Good Shepard could take it, but they don't have the room. If you are aware of anyone/ any organization that can use this food, please contact Lynne Brune. Lynne is also going to see if The Village at Cataumet could use some of it.
- The Paper Pantry will not start up again until we are able to restock after each session.

The next Vestry meeting will be Monday, October 19, 2020.

CONTINUE TO BEWARE OF SCAMMERS

The following information was received from the Diocese. Please always double check when asked for donations of ANY kind online!

Online "phishing" scams continue to target churches and clergy, and they require everyone's awareness and vigilance.

Scammers' tactics vary, but a common one is to send e-mails or text messages that appear to be from a known organization or church leader (such as a bishop or rector). They typically ask for urgent help or a favor, and request that the recipient buy and electronically send gift cards, make donations via money transfer or provide personal information.

Church leaders should inform their congregations about these scams and reinforce the message that bishops, clergy and church leaders will never ask for help or donations in this way. Recipients should be skeptical of unexpected e-mail or text message requests to send or spend money or provide urgent assistance. Check the sender's e-mail address for legitimacy before responding or opening any links or attachments. E-mail from the bishops and diocesan staff, for example, will come from the designated e-mail domain @diomass.org, not from gmail.com or other e-mail providers. If a request seems to be authentic, confirm with the requester using known contact information.

If you have loved ones or friends who are dealing with substance abuse issues, please try to have an open ear and an open heart to be there for them.
