Dear Parishioners and Friends,

November, as a title, comes from the Ancient Latin word meaning "nine." We are reminded that the original Roman calendar year was made up of 10 months. But when I think of November, I remember all the great feast days of the church – All Saints, All Souls, Samuel Seabury (the 1st U.S. Bishop), C.S. Lewis, Christ the King Sunday, St. Andrew and of course, Thanksgiving Day, one of 2 national holidays we consider "Feasts."

We turn the clocks back one hour on Sunday November 5, when daylight savings ends. As the days grow shorter and colder, we appreciate the last weeks of the long, green Pentecost season. We also appreciate knowing Jesus as "the light of the world." As the days grow darker – physically with less sun and spiritually with war, conflict, and death – remember the words of St. Paul.

"It is not ourselves that we proclaim; we proclaim Christ Jesus as Lord, and ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake. For the same God who said "Out of darkness let light shine" has caused his light to shine within us, to give the light of revelation – the revelation of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ." 2 Cor. 4:5-6

If you are not familiar with Evening Prayer or Compline, you might try praying these offices in the month ahead. They are a valuable part of our Anglican liturgical tradition. In the Book of Common Prayer, there are also 2 very short devotions for "In the early evening" and "At the close of day" (pp. 139, 140)

Enjoy the weeks ahead as we come to the end of the liturgical year and join in Thanksgiving for God's many blessings.

LITURGICAL NOTES

The Liturgical Colors

In our Episcopal / Anglican tradition there are 4 main colors used to mark the seasons and special days in the calendar. There are 4 lesser used colors that can be used as well.

White - the color of purity and holiness used for the great days of Christmas and Easter as well celebrations of some Saints and special occasions, for instance weddings.

Green - the color of growth and mission, used for the seasons of Epiphany and Pentecost-seasons when we focus on the teachings of Christ and the growth and mission of the Church.

Purple – the color of preparation and penitence, used for the seasons of Advent and Lent, as we prepare for Christ's birth and his resurrection.

Red – the color of passion, blood, fire, used for Holy Week, The day of Pentecost, and for Saints who have been martyred.

Colors also used, although rarely:

Gold – can be used instead of white, especially for Christmas and Easter. The color of royalty and richness.

Blue – sometimes used in Advent. Traditionally the color attributed to Mary, Mother of our Lord.

Rose / Pink – sometimes used for the 3rd Sunday in Advent and the 4th Sunday in Lent, celebrating a day of "refreshment" in seasons of fasting and preparation.

Black – for many years used at times of death. Now appointed for optional use on All Soul's Day (Nov. 2) and Good Friday.

WHAT IS THE



Each year a new Vestry is elected to guide your church for the upcoming year. In November the Vestry will be establishing a new Vestry for the year beginning at the Annual Meeting in February. Are you interested in joining your Vestry? We currently have 11 members – 5 on the board and 6 Members-at-Large. Here are some details that may help you.

Senior Warden – 1 year term. Works with the rector and Vestry to assure that the church is meeting the needs of the congregation.

Junior Warden – 1 year term. Same as the Senior Warden with the additional responsibility of maintaining the buildings and grounds of your church.

Treasurer – 1 year term. Handles finances for the church. Is responsible for Parochial Report. Is part of the Stewardship team.

Asst. Treasurer – 1 year term. Same as Treasurer – is back up when the Treasurer is unavailable.

Clerk – 1 year term. Is responsible for recording and keeping records of all Vestry meetings.

Members at Large – 3-year term, 2 members elected yearly; participate in meetings and assist in any way they can to guarantee the smooth running of your church.
