St. Peter's is a community called to Love, Worship, Proclaim, and Serve.

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

In May I began my third year as the Interim Rector at St. Peter's. It is unusual for an interim to last more than a year or two. Prior to coming to St. Peter's, I was the Interim Rector at St. Gabriel's in Marion for 15 months.

Our situation is different because: 1. There are a lack of candidates for parish ministry positions of Rector, and 2. St Peter's can only afford a part-time Rector, given our current budget and income.

I am convinced God will bring a Rector to St. Peter's at some future point. I am also convinced that I am to continue to serve here until either a permanent Rector is called or until I sense another call to a different ministry.

Recently we read the story of the Ascension in Acts 1 and heard Jesus tell the disciples, "It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own Authority... you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you... you will be my witnesses... to the ends of the earth..." (Acts1:8)

So, we will continue to serve Christ through the mission of St. Peter's ("to love, worship, proclaim, and serve...") together as Priest and people for the seasons ahead. The "long green season" of Pentecost is ahead. Green is the color of growth. The 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ months of this liturgical season is a time to grow in Christ and to affirm the call we hear as his "witnesses".

June brings us to summer, a season of refreshment and renewal. We will work to continue to renew and grow as a parish. Let's embrace the ministries of inviting, welcoming and connecting. Reach out in the coming weeks ahead to visitors and newcomers. Enjoy the changing seasons.

LITURGICAL NOTES

The Paschal Candle is the tall candle to the left of the altar (looking from the Nave) that is used through the 50 days of the Easter season, as well as at all Baptisms and Funerals. Pascha is the ancient Greek word for the Passover and for Easter.

The candle represents both "The pillar of cloud by day and the pillar of fire by night" that led ancient Israel through the wilderness during the Exodus as well as the new light of the Risen Christ.

Traditionally the candle is first lighted by the taper from the new fire that begins the Easter Vigil Service (see the Book of Common Prayer, p.285). It is marked with an Alpha and Omega, "Christ yesterday and today, the beginning and the end. Five grains of incense (or red or gold markers) are put into the large cross on the front, "Through his holy and glorious wounds may Christ the Lord guard and preserve us." The minister then proclaims, "May the light of Christ gloriously raising Dispel the Darkness of our hearts and minds." Carrying the candle into the congregation this affirmation is repeated, "The light of Christ....Thanks be to God."

St. Peter's has a beautiful brand new Paschal Candle used for Easter this year. In addition to the Alpha and Omega, the cross and marks, there are two striking blue bands. The top one has a bursting sun, the bottom band includes the Greek letters spelling "ichthus" – an early Christian symbol meaning the sign of a fish.
