DEAR PARISHIONERS AND FRIENDS

May is always a glorious month. Spring bursts forth with the hope of summer coming soon. Weddings and graduations are celebrated. Our nation honors all mothers on the second Sunday (May 8th), and we remember our Veterans, all who serve in the armed forces, and continue to pray for the peace of the world on Memorial Day (May 30th). Since Easter is later this year, the liturgical calendar for the entire month of May continues to celebrate the 50 great days of the Easter season. The Ascension, celebrated 40 days after The Resurrection, is on May 26. We will celebrate with a 5:30 p.m. Holy Eucharist.

The New Testament records 10 appearances of the Risen Jesus. The first five are on Easter Sunday. Four are during the next 38 days; the last is on Ascension Day. Early Christians had different experiences of encountering Jesus after The Resurrection. Many who heard of these experiences did not believe.

This is how it has always been – faith vs. unbelief. We may have had times in our lives when it has been very hard to believe Jesus actually rose from the dead. We may have encountered people who don't believe in Jesus' victory over death; who don't believe in God's love and the power of love.

Without the experience of the first Easter there would be no New Testament, no church, no understanding of Jesus' role in history. The Resurrection changed everything. It continues to change everything. Evil, sin, and death have been defeated. Yet this battle continues – faith vs. unbelief; good vs evil; love vs hate; life vs death.

I look forward to our celebrations of Easter continuing all through the month of May. I pray the new life Jesus brings continues to transform me, you, those we love, and the world continually broken by evil, sin, and death.

Alleluia. Christ is risen. The Lord is risen indeed. Alleluia. Bob

We were unable to meet in March due to an outbreak of colds and covid. We continue to meet; we will be trying to look ahead to see where we at St. Peters' can continue to help those in need. We have again started placing our fundraising loose change jug out at the second Sunday of each month in support of the Bourne Substance Free Coalition and are considering more ways to help the group. Since the first of the year we have collected \$149.00 to support the efforts of Bourne Substance Free Coalition. Thank you for the continued support.
