St. Peter's is a community called to Love, Worship, Proclaim, and Serve.

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

January begins with the celebration of the last five days of Christmas. The church recognizes a full 12 day observance of the Nativity of Jesus Christ. Our family tradition included keeping all our decorations up until at least Epiphany on January 6th, if not even longer. For many years we encouraged parishioners to bring their Christmas trees to church on Epiphany for a giant bonfire!

After the Christmas season ends, we move into a short Epiphany season in 2024 because the length of the Epiphany season is determined by the date of Easter each year. Easter Sunday is early, on March 31. We will transfer several important January feast days to the four Sundays in January:

7th, the Epiphany

14th, the Baptism of Christ

21st, the Confession of Saint Peter

28th, the Conversion of Saint Paul.

January is also the month to finish our budget preparations for 2024 and prepare for the Parish Annual Meeting on February 11. Saint Peter's continues to grow and to minister to so many in the parish and in the surrounding area. Certainly, a major parish goal for 2024 is to continue our growth and service.

Lisa Platanitis' Formation

As many of our parishioners know, Lisa Platanitis, St. Peter's Director of Music, has begun a discernment and formation process that will eventually lead to ordination as a Priest in the Episcopal Church.

After months of meeting with a Parish Discernment Committee and with Fr. Bob, Lisa was recommended to the Vestry to proceed in the process.

The Vestry voted unanimously to affirm Lisa's call and in November she met with the Diocesan Commission on Ministry. The Commission then recommended her to Bishop Allen Gates.

Bishop Gates notified Lisa in December that he has accepted her as a Postulant for the Diocese, the next step toward Ordination.

This long process continues in the months ahead for Lisa. Background checks, medical and psychological exams, and ongoing meetings with the Commission and the Diocesan Canon for Vocation will help to lead Lisa into decisions about formal seminary training and theological education.

For now, we can support Lisa with our prayers and encouragement. She will continue as St. Peter's Director of Music.

We are all excited to see Lisa move through the ordination process and the possibilities for formation in the months and years ahead.

The Lectionary Year B

Readings from scripture have been a part of both Jewish and Christian worship from the earliest days. The early church normally had 2 readings for every celebration of Holy Communion, one being a Gospel.

The Book of Common Prayer, beginning in 1549 for the Church of England, included an Epistle and a Gospel for every Eucharist. There was also a schedule of readings, including Old Testament and Psalms for Morning and Evening prayer.

The most recent 1979 B.C.P. revised the schedule of readings into a 3-year cycle (A, B, C) for the Eucharist (see B.C.P. p. 888F). And a 2-year cycle for The Daily Office, Morning and Evening Prayer (see B.C.P. p.934F).

Beginning on Advent Sunday, 12/3/23, we started using year B for our celebrations of the Holy Eucharist. For those reading Morning and/or Evening Prayer, we started Year 2 this Advent.

The Episcopal Church began using The Revised Common Lectionary (R.C.L.) in the late 1990s. This follows the B.C.P. Lectionary with some minor differences. And the R.C.L.is used by most denominations in most countries around the world.

The Sunday scriptural inserts we use at St. Peter's lists the R.C.L. and Year B on the back page. They also mention, "the scripture quotations are from the New Revised Standard Version of the Bible (1989)". Prior to this translation of the Bible, Episcopal Churches used the Revised Standard Version (R.S.V.) and/or the King James Version.
