A MESSAGE FROM REV. PATTIE HANDLOSS

Dear Friends,

This past week we remembered the Holocaust with the 75th anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz. In recent memory only the killing fields of Cambodia and the genocide in Africa equal this evil. We have lesser evil in our world but it is evil none the less. The children taken from their parents at the Southern border is tragic—and evil.

We in our family lost everyone but my grandfather to the evil of a government that grew too large. With that power, the government of the Third Reich managed to eliminate anyone the leader thought a danger to the state. A reckless and immoral genocide occurred. We were not Jewish but Catholic. The killing of the family was just one of many atrocities done as a result of the war.

It still affects those of us who heard the stories of the war and the killing. It had its effect on me. I do not trust large governmental power. For a time, I worried about the capacity of human goodness to stand against such power and hence the possibility of evil coming into our lives. I trust human goodness beyond measure because I have seen it rise to the fore often enough.

I still fear immoral leaders and we have had them in recent years on both sides of the political rainbow. But I believe we can stand up for something bigger and better than these men who have set a standard so low that I shudder when I think of those who have excused the behaviors.

We have a leader, if you will, Jesus, who set a high bar for human behavior and kept a low bar for forgiveness and acceptance. One need not be perfect to follow Jesus. We are all perfectly imperfect. And in that place there is forgiveness and love and hope.

We must remember the holocaust and how it was allowed to happen and we must use our faith as a preventive tool to defend those who are not "us" from it ever happening again. You see, we are the bearers of hope in this world. And of love. Sometimes that love will require more than we thought we could muster. But if we do not extend the love of Christ into the darkness of genocides and hate, who will?

Remember the Holocaust always. Let the memory of those who died always be a blessing to us and a reminder. It is we, as Christians, who must defend those who have no power to defend themselves.

Being a Christian is a gift. Acting as a Christian is a grace. The world needs grace and love more than ever in these days. Be the voice of love in the darkness—always.

Thank you for your Continued Support This past year the total amount of funds raised was \$1,821.75. This amount was realized by hosting a pizza party, which netted \$400, a raffle which made \$425 and our monthly collection jug, which yielded \$996.75.

In our efforts to support the Coalition the change jug will continue to be available on the second Sunday of each month, but we will not be having another fundraiser this spring. Thank you for your continued support for the Bourne Substance Free Coalition. They are most appreciative of the support from St. Peters. Our neighbors at The Church of the Good Shepard in Wareham offer a monthly Addiction Drop-in Center on the Third Wednesday of every month. Held in their parish hall, it is a place where anyone suffering addiction, or who is dealing with a family member who is suffering, can stop in and receive information and advice on dealing with the issues surrounding this disease. They also offer free training in the use of NARCAN at these gatherings.
