Epiphany is the church season between Christmas and Lent. The ancient Greek word means manifestation, revelation, a showing forth.

We celebrate 3 events in the life of Jesus Christ during Epiphany; His appearance to the 3 wise men, Magi, shortly after his birth; His baptism by John when he was 30 years old; His first miracle in Cana at a wedding.

So, after celebrating Jesus' birth, we consider how Jesus appears to us? What manifestations of God's incarnate love do we see?

The national holiday celebrating Dr. Martin Luther King on the 3rd Monday this month reminds us of all the work that has been done for civil rights and all the work we still have to do.

The Feast days of St. Peter's Confession (18th) and St. Paul's Conversion (25th) celebrate the Church's commitment to bring Jesus' Good News of God's love to all the world.

We have work to do in the year ahead. St. Peter's needs to move from post-Covid stability to growth in membership, stewardship, and programs. We will continue to discern how God is calling us to share Christ's epiphany in our own time and place.

This year you donated 47 coats along with hats, scarves and gloves that will be cleaned and distributed to those in need in the South Eastern Massachusetts area.

<u>A note from your Treasurer – January 2023</u>

I want to thank everyone who has made a financial contribution to St. Peter's in 2022. Your annual letter detailing all of your donations/pledges is coming to you very shortly. Along with this letter I am also sending you a tax receipt which should be used to support any tax deductions that you take for the 2022 tax year.

For pledgers, all monies received in a pledge envelope count towards your pledge, whatever the notation on the envelope denotes. This is because we do not have separate funds for buildings or heating. They are treated as normal operating expenses in our accounts. Also, once you have fulfilled your pledge any further monies you give are treated as "donations" in our accounting systems. This can result in a donation being split between the category "Pledge" and "Donation". Where this occurs, your check will show as two items, one with the suffix .1 for the pledge portion and another with the suffix .2 for the donation portion. Where cash is given two separate amounts will be shown in the report, one a pledge and one a donation with both adding to the cash you actually gave.

If you would like to help with managing our money, I would be very pleased to have a few more counters. This job is an important ministry. It only takes a few minutes after the service. Please let me know if you would like to join our team or talk to one of the team who can be found counting immediately after the service. Any extra help would be gratefully received.

I am currently working on our 2022 accounts and my report for the annual meeting. I look forward to updating you all on our finances at that time.
