Cathy and I wish for all of the people of St. Peter's on the Canal a Christmas-tide of abundance, both in receiving the gift of love and giving the gift of love. What a sweet treasure we have this year celebrating the incarnation of Love.

- The minutes from the November meeting were approved.
- Financial Report – Chuck Soule gave the vestry an update of our finances

- We have received 54 pledges amounting to \$83,202.
- Patti Metcalf updated the vestry on where the Search Committee is in the process. They are actively working on the parish profile and hope to have it completed in later January. The vestry has been asked to review the church mission, vision and core values.
- Pattie would like to have post cards with a picture of St. Peter's to send to new comers.
- We are hoping to have the Annual Meeting mid February to March 1st.
- The work on the stained glass windows has been completed.
- For Christmas Eve, we will have one service. Music and carols at 6:00, the service will start at 6:30. The bulletin was given to the vestry for review.
- We have been asked by Oakbay Brewery if they could use our parking lot for their employees, the vestry approved. Oakbay will be opening some time in May.
- The Bourne Substance Free Coalition had a raffle this year as a fund raiser. \$425.00 was raised for this project. Priscilla Ellis was the winner.
- We have placed an ad in the newspapers regarding our one Christmas Eve service.
- St. Peter's decals are available for purchase.
- We will be having an Epiphany Service on January 5th, followed by a luncheon.
- St. Peter's will be hosting a Congregational Business Practices workshop on March 14th.
- We are working to update the website.

SAINT PETER'S SUBSTANCE ABUSE AND PREVENTION SUPPORT GROUP UPDATE

This fall we were able to present the program "Opioid Abuse from The Front Lines" that featured presentations from Dr. Sarah Bernier, an emergency room physician from Tobey Hospital in Wareham, a Narcan training put on by the Aids Support Group of Cape Cod and a moving display by Cheryl Bean from Parents Helping Parents.

In our efforts to support the Bourne Substance Coalition, a raffle was held and raised \$425.00; thank you to all who participated and to Celeste for spearheading the effort and finding a donor for the ticket prize. The change jug will continue to be available on the second Sunday of each month, but we will not be having another fundraiser this year

Thank you for your continued support for the Bourne Substance Free Coalition. They are most appreciative of the support from St. Peter's. Our neighbors at The Church of the Good Shepard in Wareham offer a monthly Addiction Drop-in Center on the third Wednesday of every month.

Held in their parish hall, it is a place where anyone suffering addiction or who is dealing with a family member who is suffering, can stop in and receive information and advice on dealing with the issues surrounding this disease. They also offer free training in the use of NARCAN at these gatherings.

Please keep the Bourne and Wareham Substance Free coalitions in your prayers. We will be taking a short break for the holidays and will be planning another educational presentation for the spring. The next meeting of our group will be on Monday, March 16, 2020, at 3:33 p.m. All are welcome. Please join us.
