#### The Offertory

The offertory is that part of the service between the Peace and the Eucharistic Prayer. It marks the first of the 4 eucharistic actions: offer, bless, break, share. And it symbolizes our giving to God, as expressed in the ancient prayer, "And here we offer and present unto thee, O Lord, ourselves our souls and bodies, to be a reasonable , holy and living sacrifice unto thee..."

The offertory includes the collection of donations, the preparation of the altar for Holy Communion, words of scripture and music (at sung services).

The Book of Common Prayer lists several possible scriptures to be said by the Priest to begin the offertory (pgs. 343- 344, 376-377).

At St. Peter's we often hear "Let us walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself for us, an offering and sacrifice to God. At the 8am Sunday service we often conclude the offertory with "All things come of thee, O Lord, and of thine own have we given thee"...

Our musicians and choir normally share a special anthem or hymn during the offertory. This may conclude with a setting of "Praise God from whom all blessings flow…" When the Priest holds up the bread and wine at the end of the Eucharistic Prayer and the people proclaim "Amen," we are reminded that all of our lives are an offering to God.
