# LITURGICAL NOTES Prayers of the People

The Prayers of the People are found in the Eucharist between The Creed and The Peace (see the Book of Common Prayer p. 328 and p. 359). In Rite I the prayer is for "the whole state of Christ's Church and the world…" This prayer was used at every Eucharist until the 1979 BCP gave us 6 other forms (see BCP p. 383-393).

We are asked to pray for the "Universal Church" for "all Bishops and other ministers", for our local parish, for those in positions of authority, for "thy whole creation", for those in "trouble, sorrow, need, sickness of any other adversity", for the Faithful departed.

Among the six forms 3 read like short litanies (I, IV, V) 3 provide for more responses from the congregation (II, III, VI). There are many options for inserting specific requests and/or individual petitions and names. We are currently using Form III at both 8am and 10am on Sundays. We usually change the form through-out the liturgical year.

Our practice is to have an appointed reader come forward to the lectern and read the prayers. Parishioners in the pew and the Priest can offer specific prayers at the appointed times. We all can use this time to pray using the appointed form. Of course, there are many times for individual prayers during the Eucharist. Especially appropriate times are after entering the church before the liturgy begins, before Holy Communion, and after receiving Communion.



2024 Pledge Campaign

On Sunday, October 29th, we will celebrate the in-gathering of financial pledges for 2024. New pledge cards will be mailed to everyone on our mailing list. Parishioners are asked to bring your completed card to church at either 8am or 10am on the 29th.

Our budget for the year ahead is built upon the forecast of our pledged income. The Vestry will be preparing the 2024 budget as the 2023 year ends and in time to be presented at the Annual Meeting of the Parish this winter.

During the Sundays leading up to the 29th we will hear short testimonials from parishioners about pledging. Financial giving to St. Peter's can be based upon a percentage of income. It can also be compared to how we budget for other personal expenses. Many people contribute more to the parish than what they pledge. Our pledges support the total ministry of the parish, other than one specific ministry.

# A note from your Treasurer – October 2023

As we come towards the end of 2023, I would like to thank all those who have contributed to St Peter's thus far this year. I am pleased to be able to report that our financial position has improved in 2023. This is firstly due to receipt of two legacies from a former parishioner totaling just over \$75,000. These funds are being put into a special legacies account in our books and will be reserved for specific projects. The vestry is considering certain projects which can be funded from the legacies account. Secondly, our regular income from pledges and donations is currently running ahead of budget and we should end 2023 with a net operating surplus. Over the past three years we have experienced a net operating deficit in excess of \$33,000, largely as a result of the impact of covid. Therefore, excluding the legacies we have received, we need to generate a net operating surplus of over \$33,000 just to get our financial position back to where we were around the time Reverend Sue retired in 2019. With your help we can achieve that goal. Therefore, I encourage you to keep up the good financial work we are doing and continue with your pledges and donations in 2024 by making a pledge commitment to St. Peter's.

By the time you read this you should have received your end September pledge statements. For those of you who have fulfilled your pledges you will see that all donations received after pledge fulfillment are treated as donations and not as pledge over payments. In some cases that means splitting your checks or cash donations into two in order to balance your giving to your pledge. Split checks are shown with the suffixes .1 and .2 added to the check number in your statements. Please get in touch with me if you have any questions on your pledge statements or report any discrepancies you identify to Celeste Hankey.

All pledgers and donors will receive a tax certificate for 2023 early in 2024.
