FROM THE RECTOR

**Show me your ways, O LORD, and teach me your paths.
Lead me in your truth and teach me, for you are the God of my salvation.
Psalm 25:3-4 (Book of Common Prayer translation)**

Throughout the Bible, we often hear of the value of teaching, of instruction, of learning. Jesus is often called "Teacher" by His disciples and He does indeed teach them many things – things that they don't always remember - just as we don't always remember what we have been taught. And often we need a refresher class or perhaps even an introduction to something new to enhance our spiritual lives.

On Sunday morning, the sermon "breaks open" the scriptures to a certain degree, but not to as great an extent as our Bible Studies can. Maybe it's time to go back to school for the fall and winter terms and delve into learning more about scripture and about our faith.

Beginning **October 1**, we will return to our **Monday morning Bible Study** focusing on the readings for the upcoming Sunday and taking a look back at the readings from the day before. This Bible study is open to everyone – no training or background needed and questions and discussion welcome! **It runs from 11 – 12:30 each Monday morning.**

Beginning **October 8**, our twice/month **Women's Bible Study** will return. We have been exploring the lives of women who speak in our Bible. In this last year, we studied several women that we don't usually hear about – Esther and Judith – and they were fascinating women with extraordinary lives. There are more to come in this season ahead. The Women's Bible Study usually meets on the **2nd and 4th Mondays of the month from 12:30 – 2 p.m.** Again – all women are welcome to attend – bring a lunch and save room for the delicious cookies for dessert.

This fall we will finally have a **Youth Confirmation Class** once more. It's been a long time! Already we have 5 of our youth enrolled and we will begin our once/month gatherings on **October 14 and continue meeting on the 2nd Sunday of each month through March. We'll start with lunch about 11:45 and then go until 1:00 or so.** I am delighted that Lisa Platanitis and Melissa Scannell have agreed to be co-leaders with me for these classes. Confirmation for the Cape and Islands Episcopal parishes is set for June 15.

Adults are invited to be part of the **Inquirers Classes** which will begin during **Epiphanytide in January.** More information on these will follow.

In **Lent**, we will return to our **Bible for Dummies series** that we started this past Lent. After studying the Old Testament last time, we'll tackle the New Testament for this coming year. I anticipate that we'll have these again on **Thursday afternoons from March 7 – April 11**. If we have our last Station of the Cross up in the church by then (Hint hint – Marc Fuller!), we'll plan to end each session with a service of the "Stations of the Cross."

Lots of possibilities out there to enhance our learning – and believe me the teacher learns something every time she teaches, too!!

If you would like more information, please let me know. I welcome the opportunity to "break open" the scriptures and delve into our Episcopal faith together with both new and returning faces in these groups.

THE VISIBLE VESTRY

Vestry had their meeting on Monday, September 10, 2018.

1. Choir has now returned for the beginning of the new fall season. Thank you to Lisa and Bruce for carrying us through the summer and to the choir members who made a couple of cameo appearances during their break!
2. Deacon Bob continues to do well with his recovery and will continue alternating church services until his healing is completed hopefully within another few months.
3. September 17 is the last date for folks to drop off items for our yard sale, which will take place on Saturday, October 6 from 9:00-2:00. No clothing please, and clean items would be greatly appreciated by the volunteers who will be doing the pricing. If you would like to help us on the day of the sale, please sign up in the Narthex or contact Linda Masson or Lynne Brune. You don't need to commit to helping the whole day. Even a few hours would be appreciated.
4. Our Bake-less Bake Sale is still on. If you haven't had a chance to donate, you can still send in your donation to the church office or put your offering into the collection plate at either service on Sunday. Again, thank you for supporting this fund raiser. To date we have received \$1,151.00 in donations.
5. In an attempt to keep parishioners up to date with our current financial state-of-affairs, we will be notifying you through the Wave from time to time, of important budget information. You will note in the last Wave that Pledges have fallen behind almost \$5,000.00. Pledges are vital to our meeting our annual expected and unexpected expenses. Therefore, we want to encourage you to prayerfully consider if you are up to date on your pledge commitment for 2018.
6. Priscilla Ellis and Linda Masson have been researching the possibility of our church beginning a new Paper Pantry Outreach Ministry. **Please see the article in this Wave for more information.**
7. The mini-split air conditioning system has been installed by Local HVAC in Stephenson Hall and should be up and running shortly as soon as Steve Toth, our electrician, can complete his part of the installation **(now completed!)**. This system will provide much needed air conditioning for the kitchen as well as the parish hall. In addition, air conditioning will be provided in our large meeting room, Rev. Sue's office and the Choir Room. Hooray!! **This is all thanks to a very generous donation!**
8. A new door is also being installed in the Discovery Pre-School entrance by Abbey Glass. **Also thanks to a very generous donation!**
9. ASA Janitorial Services will begin servicing our church with a one-year contract for 2 days a week (with the option of a second year) at a cost of \$388.00 per month. They would also provide us with the option to strip and wax the floors in Stephenson Hall and the kitchen, twice a year at the cost of \$467.55 per visit.
10. Thank you to the congregation from our Substance Abuse Prevention group for your ongoing support of the Bourne Substance Free Coalition by placing your change and/or bills in the donation jar, which is placed in the Narthex on the second Sunday of each month.
11. The educational program "In Plain Sight," sponsored by the Bourne Substance Free Coalition, will be presented during our Yard Sale on October 6 from 10:00 to 12:00 in the large meeting room. We encourage all ADULTS (18 and over) to attend this informative presentation.

12. Reminder of the Blessing of the Animals which will be on October 7 at 2:00 p.m. with a rain date of October 14.

13. The Monday morning 11:00 a.m. Bible Study will start up on October 1. All are welcome to participate in this fun study which reviews, explains, and discusses the scripture readings that will occur for each of the following Sunday services. This Bible Study is so informative and educational and will help you to better understand the history behind your Sunday morning readings and sermon.

14. Men's Breakfast will begin again on October 20 and will meet this year monthly on the 3rd Saturday morning at 8 a.m. at Persy's Place Restaurant on Cranberry Highway in East Wareham.

15. Attention all Ladies! Women's Bible Study will begin on October 8 at 12:30 p.m. This Bible Study meets twice a month on the 2nd and 4th Mondays. All women are welcome to join us for a good time and lots of laughs, while studying those very interesting and sometimes provocative ladies of the Bible! Coffee and cookies provided.

16. The last St. Margaret's ladies' Friendly Kitchen meal will be on November 12. In appreciation for their years of service to our Friendly Kitchen, Vestry has voted to donate \$300.00 to St. Vincent de Paul.

17. Thanks to a lot of hard work by Lynne Brune, we are now close to everything being finalized for membership in the Greater Boston Food Bank. We are just waiting for the official contract to be signed. This will be a huge supplement to our food supply for our Friendly Kitchen teams, which will help defray costs of the Monday night meals and allow for the preparation of more nutritious meals. We will be picking up food from a location in New Bedford once a month. Thank you, Lynne!!!!

TRANSFORMING GENEROSITY

WHAT IS A PAPER PANTRY MINISTRY??

Did you know that folks who qualify for Mass Health and SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program formerly called Food Stamps) cannot purchase personal care items or paper products such as baby products, diapers, Kleenex, toilet paper, paper towels etc.?? Since this fact has been brought to our attention, we decided to further research this outreach need area. We visited St. David's Episcopal Church in South Yarmouth to observe and learn about how this program works. In addition, we met with folks from the Bourne Food Pantry to determine the actual need for such a ministry in our community. What we found was a resounding **YES** there is a huge need.

The Bourne Food Pantry was very supportive and excited to partner with us in organizing this program. Together we will share resources and especially public relations advertising on both ends. This program is not meant to provide all the needs these folks have, but to supplement their needs in any way that we can.

Our plan is to offer this program to all who qualify, one time a month, here at St. Peter's, for approximately three hours from 3:00-6:00. These hours are being considered to best accommodate

individuals who have daytime employment, who need to use public transportation, and who do not care to drive at night.

Although this ministry is not scheduled to begin until January, much planning needs to begin now. Therefore, we will need a committee of folks who feel called to help organize this program. We would like to have our first meeting some time, soon to be determined, in October.

If you feel as excited about this Ministry as we do, **we want you!!** You can make a big difference in someone's life by giving only three hours once a month of your volunteer time.

HIDDEN IN PLAIN SIGHT - INFORMATION ALL PARENTS NEED TO KNOW - OCTOBER 6 - 10 AM - 12 NOON

If you are raising a child, this is an opportunity you do not want to miss!

The Bourne Substance Free Coalition, sponsored by the Bourne High School Nye Grant, will be hosting a free program called *Hidden in Plain Sight* at **St. Peter's-on-the-Canal on Saturday, October 6, 2018 from 10:00 AM to 12:00 NOON in the back meeting room area.**

Hidden in Plain Sight is an interactive education program for parents/guardians featuring an exhibit where adults are encouraged to explore and interact with a display designed to resemble a teenager's bedroom. Throughout the exhibit are items that may indicate that a teenager may be involved in some high-risk behavior such as substance abuse, underage drinking, eating disorders, sexual activity and other dangers.

Following an exploration of the mock bedroom exhibit, resources will be provided and members of the Bourne Substance Free Coalition will be available to answer questions. The Bourne Substance Free Coalition membership includes the Bourne Police, the Barnstable County Sheriff's office, school personnel, therapists and other members of the community.

Child care will be available and there is no charge to attend this program.
