## *DEAR PARISHIONERS AND FRIENDS*

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 2, this year. We look forward to the fullness of this season to help us prepare for Holy Week and Easter, which will be Sunday, April 17<sup>th</sup>. In 2020, the Covid shutdown came in the middle of Lent. Last year St. Peter's was not worshipping in person during Lent.

Our Sunday worship sets the tone for this season of penitence and preparation. We do not use the word "Alleluia". The Great Litany, the 10 Commandments and the Penitential Order help us to begin the liturgies.

The word "Lent" is derived from an old Anglo-Saxon word meaning "Spring", when the days lengthen (from the same source word as Lent). In the history of the church, the weeks before Easter were set aside for preparing adults for Holy Baptism. This also became a time for self-examination, prayer, and acts of mercy. Eventually, 40 days were set aside, symbolizing Jesus' 40 days in the wilderness at the start of his ministry.

The popular practice of "giving something up" for Lent can be a great help in finding time for prayer, reading, exercise, serving in some meaningful way. If I choose to give something up, I need to consider what I'll take on, add to my life.

In addition to our Sunday worship, we'll have some Lenten resources available, and we will gather at noon on Thursdays in the church for the Stations of the Cross and Holy Eucharist.

I look forward to our Lenten pilgrimage this year at St. Peter's. May the weeks ahead fill us with God's grace, love and peace.

## *ASH WEDNESDAY, MARCH 2<sup>nd</sup>*

This year we will observe Ash Wednesday with two services, one at 12 noon, without music, and one at 5:30 p.m. with music. Both services will include the imposition of ashes and the full Book of Common Prayer liturgy. The Diocese has asked that ashes be administered by using individual Q-tips for each person.

## *THURSDAYS IN LENT*

Starting on March 10<sup>th</sup>, and continuing for the 17<sup>th</sup>, 24<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup> of March, we will gather in the church at 12 noon to use the devotion, "The Way of the Cross", marking the 14 stations traditionally observed. These stations are on the walls of the church nave at St. Peter's. Since we do not have any side aisles, we will simply observe each station from our places in the nave.

Booklets will be available. A passage from the Bible is read at each station followed by a prayer. A verse from the hymn, Stabat Mater, (Hymnal 159) is read as we "move" from station to station.

This tradition began as pilgrims in Jerusalem marked Jesus' final journey from Pilate's courtyard to Calvary. The Franciscans popularized the practice in local churches through-out the middle ages. Eight of the stations are based on events recorded in the Gospels. Six are based on tradition.

After we use "The Way of the Cross" we will share Holy Communion, preparing for Maundy Thursday, when we celebrate Jesus' institution of the Holy Eucharist. The entire service will take about 45 minutes. There will not be music.

Assuming Covid restrictions will allow as we move closer to spring, parishioners and guests are invited to bring a bag lunch and gather for informal discussion after the liturgy. We will discuss the stations and the "Way of Love," the devotion Presiding Bishop Michael Curry has given us.

Education opportunities were developed and presented to the congregation and a fundraising campaign was begun to support the Bourne Substance Free Coalition.

The group was able to meet a few times in 2021. As we continue to meet, we will be trying to look ahead to see where we at St. Peter's can continue to help those in need. We have again started placing our fundraising loose-change jug out on the second Sunday of each month, in support of the Bourne Substance Free Coalition and we are considering more ways to help the group.

The Aids Support Group of Cape Cod has refreshed our in-house Narcan Kits, and we are working with them to develop some educational programs, including Narcan Training. We hope you can join with us in prayer and conversation the next time we meet. "All Are Welcome." We are taking a short break due to the recent outbreak of Covid and will meet again on March 21<sup>st</sup>, at 3:33 p.m. at the Church.
