I love September as we look ahead. Let us continue "looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our Faith..." (Hebrews 12:2).

on Interim Ministry

For the next several issues of Wave I will share my own perspective on 5 areas congregations need to "study" as they go through transitions: 1. Story/ history 2. Mission 3. Leadership 4. Connections 5. Future. In this September issue, I will look at our Story and History - Part I, "Founding and Growth," 1938-1998 Part II, "Decline, Crisis, Recovery, 1999-2025, will be in the October Wave.

# Founding and Growth, 1938-1998

Episcopalians in Buzzards Bay gathered together in 1938 to start a mission named St. Peters Church. They met in a community hall under the leadership of Archdeacon Howard Bartow until being led by Fr. Samuel Stephenson in 1944. Working with the Bishop, Fr. Stephenson arranged for an unused church building in Hull to be shipped on a barge down Massachusetts Bay, and through the Cape Cod Canal to Buzzards Bay. Thus, in 1947 St. Peter's was "planted" on Main St.

Two Quonset huts from Otis Air Force Base were added, along with several repairs and additions and the little congregation began to grow. Fr. Stephenson accepted another call in 1951 and for the next 7 years the Mission church was led by 2 faithful Priests. In 1958 Fr. Stephenson returned and helped the parish to grow and achieve Parish Status in 1965.

After Fr. Stephenson retired in 1968, the parish was led by 2 rectors for the next 14 years, the second being Fr. Phil Jacobs who served several parishes in the Diocese before retiring in Mattapoisett. It is unclear why the years 1982 - 1988 were filled with changing clergy leadership. Fr. Richard Signore was called in 1988 and served at St Peter's for 16 years.

After achieving Parish Status in 1965, St Peter's enjoyed steady growth, as did the Episcopal Church nationally. Even with the changes and turmoil of the 1970's St. Peter's grew. On Easter Sunday 1989 attendance at the 8am service was 56; 193 attended at 10am. Many long-time parishioners remember active ministries with Sunday School, youth groups, classes, and all kinds of programs.

All this began to change in the late 1990's and early 2000's. On Easter Sunday in 2004 attendance at 8am was 40; at 10am 118. The numbers 7 weeks later on Pentecost are even more revealing- 23 at 8am, 68 at 10am. Many factors led to the growth of St. Peter's for 60 years from 1938 to 1998. The 3 main contributors were the growth of Buzzards Bay and the surrounding areas; steady clergy and lay leadership; overall national and regional expansion of the Episcopal Church.


