## *DEAR PARISHIONERS AND FRIENDS*

We will enjoy Easter Sunday on April 17<sup>th</sup>. This is about a week shorter than the latest Easter can be celebrated and we can hope for a beautiful spring day. Regardless of the weather, Holy Week and Easter Sunday are the 8 most sacred days in our liturgical calendar. The Passion and Glory of Jesus Christ is the foundation for our Christian Faith and for life all year round.

It all starts on what The Book of Common Prayer calls The Sunday of the Passion: Palm Sunday. We begin by observing Our Lord's entry into Jerusalem in triumph as he was proclaimed, "King, Son of David, Redeemer of the World." Palm branches, the hymn "All glory, laud, and honor," and a procession into the church introduce us to the start of Holy Week.

But the feel of the day changes quickly as the prayers before the readings remind us of Jesus' "pain", "suffering" and "death upon the cross." This year we will read Luke's account of the Passion. The entire congregation has parts to read. After Holy Communion we depart in silence and darkness.

We will not have any services at St. Peter's on Monday, Tuesday, or Wednesday in Holy Week. I suggest you read the collects for each day, BCP p. 220. You may also want to read the Gospel stories that tell us about the events early in the week – The anointing at Bethany, John 12:1-11; the cleansing of the temple, Mark 11:15-13; the betrayal of Judas, Matthew 26:1-5, 14-25.

The name "Maundy" Thursday is derived from the Latin "mandatum" meaning "commandment." We are reminded of Jesus' words at the Last Supper, "A new commandment I give you, that you love one another as I have loved you..." (John 13:34). This love is symbolized in John's account of Jesus washing feet, 13:1-15 and Luke's account of Jesus instituting the Holy Eucharist, 22:14-30. The service ends with the reservation of the sacrament, the stripping of the altar, silence, and darkness.

On Good Friday we will observe the Stations of the Cross with prayers at 12 noon. At 5:30pm we will use the full service from the Book of Common Prayer, p. 276-282. This includes the Passion according to John, the Solemn Collects, the Veneration of the Cross and Holy Communion from the Reserved Sacrament.

On Easter Sunday we will have our Festive Eucharists at the usual times of 8 and 10 am. Easter is celebrated as a season for 50 days, until Pentecost on June 5<sup>th</sup>. What a joy it is to look forward to celebrating Holy Week and Easter Sunday at St. Peter's for the first time since 2019.

My hope and prayer for us during this sacred season is that we might each rejoice in the new life and love that the Risen Christ offers us. Our world is living through the darkness of evil, war and death. God knows this and is with us, especially with all who suffer and face evil and death.

We rejoice and celebrate God's love for us, our love for each other, and the power of love to transform individuals and this world.

## *THE VISIBLE VESTRY*

March 29, 2022

Lisa Platanitis and Melissa Scannell gave a presentation asking to introduce a smaller Friendly Kitchen mission. It would be called FK 2 Go, and would be take-out bag meals only. They discussed how it would be accomplished, including plans for fund raising. Handouts were given regarding the roles of the Vestry members as well as the role of the Interim Priest.

We are looking into streamlining the Mission Statement to be more succinct.

We reviewed the By-Laws. More work will be done to complete the updating.

We discussed the proposal from Kelly O'Connor regarding the concept of "Priest Sharing". At this time, the Vestry is open to the idea, but not to this particular grouping.

Special Events coming up are: 75th anniversary of St. Peter's as well as a visit from Bishop Gates on June 12th. We are considering a Canal cruise for the parishioners as a fun event. We need more coffee hour hosts.

Fundraising - we are looking into Amazonsmile.com. More information to follow.

Outreach - we are considering easy-to-participate outreach projects such as white sock donations for the homeless, working with Samaritan's Purse.

There is a Walk for Hope to raise money for Housing for Cape Cod. The walk is May 22 in any of three towns - Falmouth, Hyannis or Orleans. For more information, please contact Celeste Hankey.

The minutes from the February meeting and financial reports for March were approved. The Vestry approved spending approximately \$4,000 to repair Smalley Street (the entrance to St. Peter's). The town will not repair this area, as Smalley Street is not a town-approved street.

As things have changed since Covid, the Search Committee will be asked to update our profile.

The next meeting of the Vestry will be Tuesday, April 19th.

## *THE BELLS OF ST PETER'S...LET THEM RING!*

The tradition of ringing church bells dates back to 400 A.D. when Paulinus of Nola, a Roman poet, writer and Senator, first introduced bells to Christian worship.

Bells have been used in the past to notify the town's people of fire, storms or to call important gatherings. The use of bells in a musical fashion originated in the 16th century.

A Carillon is a musical instrument usually housed in the bell tower of a church.

The instrument consisted of at least 23 cast bronze cup shaped bells which would be played to produce a melody or sounded together to play a chord. The word "carillon" is from the French "Quadrillion", meaning four bells. Most modern Carillons are operated electronically.

In 1964, a 25-note Carillon was donated by a member of St. Peter's and was upgraded in 2012 to an Adagio Digital Carillon. We are very blessed to have this amazing instrument gifted.

During the pandemic, St. Peter's Carillon called us together, as it rang out our favorite Advent and Christmas hymns in December 2020 and again in 2021.

This year, however, sadly, the Carillon has been silent. One of the components of the unit has gone bad and needs to be replaced. This is the amplifier that makes the sound come out of the speakers. The cost of replacement for this is \$1800.00.

If you feel called to help financially with this need, please contact the Music Director.

Come on, let's ring those bells again!

We were unable to meet in March due to an outbreak of colds and covid. We continue to meet; we will be trying to look ahead to see where we at St. Peters' can continue to help those in need. We have again started placing our fundraising loose change jug out at the second Sunday of each month in support of the Bourne Substance Free Coalition and are considering more ways to help the group. **Since the first of the year we have collected \$149.00 to support the efforts of Bourne Substance Free Coalition.
