## *STATIONS OF THE CROSS*

The Stations of the Cross are a wonderful way to spend a little time remembering and praying about Our Lord's journey to the Cross. This year Lisa Platanitis will lead us in music from Taize on the first and the last Thursday of the Lenten journey, March 5 and April 2. The theme of this year's Lenten evening will be "Walking in Love" using the Presiding Bishop Michael Curry's book as the basis for the Walk of the Stations.

The Lenten Sermons will also be on the theme of the journey of love that leads us to Easter.

## *THE VISIBLE VESTRY*

The February Vestry meeting was held on Monday, February 17, 2020

- The minutes from the January meeting were approved.
- Financial Report – Dianne Cartmill gave the vestry an update of our finances
- Dianne Cartmill shared with the vestry an updated draft of the budget for 2020.
- A few parishioners have paid their pledges in full.
- The committee continues to work on the parish profile and hope to have it completed shortly.
- Margery Buckingham will serve as Deanery Representative.
- St. Peter's will be hosting a Congregational Business Practices workshop on March 14<sup>th</sup>. Dianne Cartmill, Lynne Brune, Alan Kershaw, Celeste Hankey and Kathy Letzeisen will attend.
- In March, envelopes will be distributed for a one time donation to replenish the Capital Campaign account. Money has taken out of this account for the restoration and repair of the stained glass windows.
- We are looking into improving the lights in the church.
- The repair to the steeple and ceiling upstairs will be covered by insurance with only a \$1,000 deductible.

The next Vestry meeting will be on Monday, March 16, 2020.

### **Vestry Retreat February 22, 2020**

- The Vestry reviewed the agenda for the day.
- The Vestry broke into small groups to discuss the following: Administration, Communications, Outreach, Parish Life and Pastoral Care.
- Administration – We are going to review the By-Laws – Donna, Alan and Celeste will be on this committee. Len and Dianne are on the Stewardship Committee. We would like to start a Finance Committee but are waiting until after the Congregational Business Practices meeting on March 14<sup>th</sup>. There was discussion as to what, if anything, can be done with the open space to the side of the church. We have to fix the chimes. Lynne and Celeste will work on inventory of the church. Robin and Celeste will update the bulletin boards.
- Communications – Newcomer packets are almost ready. We will have name tags for all parishioners. We are looking into streaming our services on cable.
- Outreach – We have many, successful outreach programs – no changes here.
- Parish Life – we would like to have quarterly joint Sunday services followed by some sort of meal. Some people would enjoy Morning Prayer occasionally. We're going to have a Did You Know – a little blurb about parts of the church. We need more help with coffee hour. We need more acolytes, ushers and altar guild members. We would like to be involved with Canal Day as a fund raiser.
- Pastoral Care – we should be using our LEVs more. We would like to reestablish the library. We send cards to shut-ins – we need donations of cards and stamps.

## *ABOUT LENT MADNESS*

Lent Madness began in 2010 as the brainchild of the Rev. Tim Schenck (<http://www.clergyconfidential.com/p/about-father-tim.html>). In seeking a fun, engaging way for people to learn about the men and women comprising the Church's Calendar of Saints, Tim came up with this unique Lenten devotion. Combining his love of sports with his passion for the lives of the saints, Lent Madness was born on his blog "Clergy Family Confidential (<http://frcim.wordpress.com/>)" which has subsequently moved locations and become "Clergy Confidential (<http://clergyconfidential.blogspot.com>)."

The format is straightforward: 32 saints are placed into a tournament-like single elimination bracket. Each pairing remains open for a set period of time and people vote for their favorite saint. Sixteen saints make it to the Round of the Saintly Sixteen; eight advance to the Round of the Elate Eight; four make it to the Faithful Four; two to the Championship; and the winner is awarded the coveted Golden Halo. The first round consists of basic biographical information about each of the 32 saints. Things get a bit more interesting in the subsequent rounds as we offer quotes and quirks, explore legends, and even move into the area of saintly kitsch. **If you are not sure about terminology, check out our glossary (<https://lentmadness.org/wp-content/uploads/2012/01LENT-MADNESS-GLOSSARY.pdf>). It's free!**

The major change from 2010 to 2011 was the introduction of four "celebrity bloggers" to champion particular saints through the Faithful Four. In 2012 we partnered with **Forward Movement** (<http://forwardmovement.org/>) and Executive Director Scott Gunn to create our own website and broaden the number of people involved in the writing process, with Tim and Scott serving as the self-appointed Supreme Executive Committee.

Along the way we've added more celebrity bloggers, a poster-sized bracket, weekly Monday Madness videos, and the *Saintly Scorecard*, an annual publication containing all 32 first round bios, information about how to participate in Lent Madness as a congregation, and an essential Vocabulary List to decipher all things Lent Madness.

We also inspired thousands of people along the way by forming an online community of people who are passionate about taking their faith but not themselves too seriously. Articles and spots about Lent Madness have appeared in the *Washington Post*, NPR, Huffington Post, FOXNews, NBC, USAToday, and even *Sports Illustrated*.

As Lent Madness continues to grow and evolve, what won't change is the essence of Lent Madness: allowing people to get to know some amazing people who have come before us in the faith and reminding one another that there's no reason for dreary Lenten discipline. If this helps people connect with the risen Christ during this season of penitence and renewal, and have a bit of fun in the process, then it continues to be worthwhile.

We hope you'll participate fully this Lent and vote with reckless abandon! (Once—this isn't Chicago).
