## St. Peter's is a community called to Love, Worship, Proclaim, and Serve.

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Jesus appeared 10 times after his resurrection on Easter Day according to the Gospel narratives. Five of those appearances were on the First Sunday, beginning with Mary Magdalene and ending with the 10 Disciples that evening.

The other five appearances take place in both Jerusalem and Galilee over the next 5  $\frac{1}{2}$  weeks. We celebrate the last appearance, the Ascension on May 18th this year.

Our Sunday Gospels in May return us to Jesus' teaching before his Passion and Glory all recorded in John's Gospel: May 7- "I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life "; (John 14) May 14- "I am the Vine, you are the branches"; (John 15) May 21- The Prayer of Jesus before his arrest in the garden; (John 17) May 28- The gift of the Holy Spirit; (John 20).

May is always a month to celebrate the new life in creation that bursts forth as the weeks of Spring progress. The 50 days of the Easter Season give us an opportunity to celebrate new life and renewal in our personal and corporate lives.

Alleluia, Christ has Risen.

The Lord is Risen Indeed. Alleluia.

Each month in the Wave we will feature a short explanation of a part of our Eucharistic liturgy. This might include a prayer, a certain action, and/or a traditional practice. Liturgy varies from parish to parish, Priest to Priest. If you have a question or concern, or something you'd like to learn more about, please contact Fr. Bob or a member of the Vestry. We begin with 2 notes this month.

<u>Incense</u>, often referred to as "frankincense", has been used since ancient times in both Jewish and other religions. In the Old Testament the burning of incense was part of the offering made in the temple by the Priest. It came to be seen as having purifying power and was a costly sacrifice, suitable for royalty (thus, a gift for the infant Jesus). The offering of incense also symbolized the offering of prayer, "Let my prayer be set forth in your sight as incense..." Ps. 141:2

Since at least the 5th century incense has been used in Christian Worship, as a blessing and offering. Normally incense is used in the Eucharist to bless the Altar, the Gospel Book, the Communion Bread and Wine, and those participating in the liturgy – clergy, choir, congregation. At St. Peter's we will use incense on very special occasions.

<u>Mixed Chalice</u> refers to the traditional practice of pouring a small amount of blessed water into the wine prior to the prayer of consecration. It symbolizes the divinity and humanity of Christ, the connection between Baptism and Communion, and the report from John's Gospel of the spear thrust into the side of Jesus at the Crucifixion. (19:34). The following prayer is said as the water is blessed, "May this water and wine be so commingled to remind us that Christ humbled himself to take on our humanity, that we, by his grace, might share in his divinity."
