## FROM THE RECTOR The Reverend Sue Lederhouse

This year, all of our Sundays in January are in the Epiphany season and the Epiphany season encompasses February and the first Sunday in March as well. Traditionally we think of the Epiphany season as that season in which we encounter Jesus as an adult beginning His ministry. However, we begin this season of Epiphany with the Feast of the Epiphany on Sunday, January 6. Jesus is still a child when the Three Kings come to visit after being guided by a star. The Kings, also known as the Wise Men, bring gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. These are strange gifts for a baby, but gifts that foreshadow who this baby will become.

On January 13, we celebrate the Baptism of Jesus. Jesus begins His ministry – as we do, too – with baptism. In His case, it is baptism from John the Baptist, a different sort of baptism from what we experience, but it represents a new direction for Jesus. After His baptism, Jesus goes off to the wilderness for 40 days to pray and fast and learn what God would have Him do (we hear about His time in the wilderness on March 10.) On January 20, we will hear about His first miracle at the Wedding of Cana. This is followed on January 27 by His return to Nazareth and His proclamation of His mission as He reads from the prophet Isaiah in the synagogue. This will be continued on February 3.

For the rest of February, we will hear about the calling of the first disciples and the Sermon on the Plain (as contrasted with Jesus' Sermon on the Mount in Matthew's Gospel). The Last Sunday after the Epiphany is March 3 and once more we are on the mountain top of Transfiguration with Jesus and His three closest disciples, Peter, James, and John as we see Jesus in a new light.

Epiphany is one of my most favorite seasons of the Church Year. I particularly enjoy the words in our worship in Epiphany just before the Sanctus (the "Holy, Holy, Holy"): "Because in the mystery of the Word made flesh, You have (God has) caused a new light to shine in our hearts, to give the knowledge of Your (God's) glory in the face of Your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord." These words speak of the mystery that we have encountered at Christmas: how Christ came to earth to be born of a woman, to be human flesh and blood. They also speak of the Light of Christ that is so much a part of the Epiphany season and our discovery of that Light shining in our own lives as well as our response to that discovery.

So in this Epiphany season, come journey with the Wise Men, remember your baptism, and feel your own sense of call in the midst of that wonderful Light of Christ shining upon each one of us.

#### THE DEACON'S CORNER

It's January, another year gone and a new one opening up before us. What are we going to do with it? Let me say right off that I don't want to talk about Epiphany, the Conversion of St. Paul, the Confession of St. Peter, or any of that "churchy" stuff. You'll hear all about that at Sunday morning services anyway. Definitely, don't want to talk about New Year's Resolutions either.

No, what's on my mind right now is the chaos in the world, in our country, the past year, and all those we've known who were so important to us, but are no longer with us. Must be my Scot's Celtic soul. We always get maudlin about the events and places of the year past. Music speaks to us powerfully too. It's customary to sing Bobby Burns' 200 year old Scot's salute to the Old and New Year, *"Auld Lang Syne,"* on New Year's Eve. The phrase has been around for more than 400 years, but Burns was the first to write the words down. It means literally "old long since", or "days gone by." It's a good way to end one year and begin another.

There's another Christmas/New Year's song that Nancy called to my attention today. It was written in 1971 by John Lennon and Yoko Ono. It's called *"And So This is Christmas"*. Recall this song as you read some of the lyrics\*:

"So this is Christmas And what have you done Another year over And a new one just begun

And so this is Christmas I hope you have fun The near and the dear one The old and the young

A very Merry Christmas And a happy new year Let's hope it's a good one Without any fear"

There's more, but you get the picture. The words pose a challenge to us to weigh the challenges of the past year and our response to them. How could we have done better? I think they also call us to face the New Year hopefully and do what we can do to make the lives of others easier, less fearful.

#### STEWARDSHIP UPDATE

As of **December 27**, we have **62** pledges for a **total of \$99,420**. If you have not made a pledge yet for 2019, please do so as soon as possible. If you have been a regular contributor but have not made a pledge, please consider pledging. This is a real help to us as we develop our budget for 2019. It helps us better gauge how much money we can expect and also ensures that your contributions can be tracked more easily.

#### EPIPHANY AT ST. PETER'S

The season of Epiphany varies in length depending on the date of Easter. This year we have a VERY LONG season of Epiphany. It is almost as long as Epiphany can be with 9 Sundays. It starts on Sunday, January 6 with our traditional visit of the Wise Men and ends with Shrove Tuesday which this year will be March 5. The color for the Epiphany season is white (the color of joy and celebration) through the First Sunday after Epiphany (January 13) in which we celebrate the Baptism of Christ. Then it switches to green (the color of mission and growth) until the Last Sunday after Epiphany (March 3) when the color is white once more.

During Epiphany, we make a few changes in our liturgy. At the 8:00 service, we will return to Eucharistic Prayer II (p. 340). At the 10:00 service, we will be using Eucharistic Prayer B (beginning on p. 367). For our service music, we will use the Rutter "Glory to You, Lord God of Our Fathers" (Hymnal S-236) as our Song of Praise; "In Your Church, Lord, Be Glorified" for the Presentation; "Santo, Santo, Santo" (an Argentine folk song) for the Sanctus; "Now the Silence" for the Fraction Anthem and "The Lord is My Light and My Salvation" for the Post-Communion Hymn. Most of these will be on an insert in the bulletin.
